

WORKFORCE AT BROADSTAIRS FOLK WEEK 11-18 August 2017

We need around 250 fabulous people to volunteer for us each year – without you we cannot run the festival. You will be part of a great and well thought of team. Around 80% of our volunteers return each year, and should apply by 1st May to guarantee their usual team place.

Applications will be acknowledged within 2 weeks of receipt. New volunteers should send a photo for their identity pass. All volunteers will be notified of their teams and duties in July.

Duties

In return for around 35 hours work – around 4.5 hours a day - we offer you a festival ticket and camping (if required), a Workforce T shirt, and a warm fuzzy feeling.

- Your priority as a volunteer is to carry out your shifts in a friendly and efficient manner. You should take your responsibilities seriously and be punctual and reliable.
- We expect you to wear the free Workforce t-shirt and badge, while on duty, so everyone knows you are on the team. The festival reserves the right to dismiss volunteers if they bring the festival into disrepute.
- Our volunteer teams each have a manager who will direct you in your duties, and assist with any issues you may have. If problems cannot be resolved by the manager, the Festival Director, Artistic Director or Chairman can be called upon.

Terms & Conditions

- Volunteers should be aged 18 and over; some exceptions may be made for 17 year olds – please contact us for details.
- If you miss a shift without a valid reason you may have your festival pass taken away, and future applications to join our workforce will not be accepted.
- If you have children with you, it is not possible to fulfil your duties and look after them at the same time; you must arrange for a carer. Children and carers must pay for tickets at the full rate.
- Please inform us of any disabilities or medical conditions which may restrict the duties you can perform so that we can offer you a suitable job.
- If you wish to work with a friend we will try to accommodate this wherever possible, but you must tell us when you apply and we cannot guarantee it.
- Volunteer stewards are not allowed to smoke or drink alcohol whilst on duty or whilst dealing with customers.
- It is the duty of all volunteers not to take risks to their personal safety.

We want you to enjoy your volunteering experience, and welcome feedback.

The Festival Campsite

The Festival campsite at Charles Dickens School CT10 2RL opens at 10.00am on Friday 11th August. Please see Folk Week website for more details of facilities etc

All workforce t-shirts, ID badges, rotas etc must be collected from the campsite Admin/Check-in before your duty begins.

Only essential set-up personnel and campsite workforce will be allowed to camp on Thursday evening prior to the festival and you need to notify us of your intention to do so. Volunteers should go to the office to report in and collect ID badges etc.

No-one is allowed on the campsite without a valid ticket for Folk Week or workforce ID badge.

The campsite must be vacated by midday on Saturday 19th August.

Please let us know which field you would like to camp in. We will allocate you one pitch. Camping terms and conditions apply.

Currently, the campsite fields are as follows:

Field A – nearer to school building, catering, showers, entertainment and Panic Circus. Late night sessions take place in school building.

Field B – Furthest from school, catering etc. No late night sessions on-site. Toilets and showers in both fields. Pedestrian gate between fields.

NB All cars must be parked on car parks, not adjacent to tents.

No electrical hook ups on either field. If you are camping, please be considerate to your neighbours. The campsite is in a residential area and unreasonable levels of noise from any part of the fields may result in problems for the festival in the future and we may have to ask noisy or disruptive campers to leave.

No animals other than guide dogs are allowed on to the Festival campsite
